We have winterizing materials: Burlap, tree wrap, vinyl tree-guards, fertilizers, pruners, organic insecticides, gardening gloves, animal repellent, mulch, Wilt-Pruf, and many more items.

Plant Winterizing Check List

Check soil for moisture. It's important that your plants go into winter with moisture in the ground. The evergreens especially need to be watered up until the ground freezes.

Prune summer blooming shrubs. Remove any dead, broken, or diseased limbs from all shrubs.

Check stems and leaves of shrubs for insect eggs and remove or for live insects and treat with appropriate insecticide.

Cut dead perennials back to a few inches from the ground.

Remove all old foliage debris from around your plants. Diseases (fungi), insects, and rodents can over-winter in the debris.

Fertilize your trees and shrubs after their leaves turn with a fertilizer like Plant-Tone or Tree-Tone. Fertilize evergreens and other acid-soil-loving plants (Rhododendrons, Blueberries, Hollies, Mt. Ash, and Oaks) with Holly-Tone.

Mulch roots for winter protection.

Wrap your tree trunks to prevent frost-cracking and rodent damage. (Rodents especially like the bark of young fruit trees.)

Put up fencing to stop other animal damage or spray to deter them.

Spray an anti-desiccant like Wilt-Pruf to prevent winter burning & moisture loss on evergreens, especially Rhododendrons.

Use burlap or use wooden shrub protectors on any shrubs in high snow volume areas.
